Committee volunteers usually serve beginning the Friday of the Annual Meeting after the Executive Board meets. Appointments to the following ACJS Standing Committees are for one year, unless otherwise stated:

- Assessment Committee

- Budget, Finance, and Audit Committee (the 2nd Vice President nominates two Members)
- Committee on National Criminal Justice Month (Open to Membership, including Doctoral Student Members)
- Constitution and By-Laws Committee (Members serve three-year terms)
- **Doctoral Summit Committee** (Members are appointed by the 1ST Vice President)
- Employment Exchange Committee
- Ethics, Equity, and Professional Conduct Committee (Members are nominated by the Trustees-At-Large and appointed by the ACJS Executive Board and serve three-year terms)
- **Membership Committee** (Open to Membership, including Doctoral Student Members)
- Mentoring Committee
- Nominations and Elections Committee (selected by Immediate Past President)
- **Program Committee** (Applicants need to describe area of expertise)
- Public Policy Committee (Members serve three-year terms)
- Student Affairs Committee (Open to Membership, including Doctoral Student Members)
